## Ponderings from your Pastor

Happy New Year!

In some ways, January is an exciting month because it is a transitional month — a month of beginnings. January is a perfect moment to consider which direction we're going as we face the year unfolding before us.

The question for us as we enter the year 2019 is whether we will look forward through the eyes of faith, or backward toward what once was. And in this discussion, the Bible can help us. The Israelites were continually asked to look back at the miraculous things God had done for them, most notably, of course, deliverance from centuries of slavery in Egypt. It's not always a bad thing to look back on the past. In fact, in the Bible we are given constant reminders to "forget not all his benefits" (Psalm 103:2). Looking back and remembering. But looking backward can also be dangerous and destructive. Lot's wife famously looked back and became a pillar of salt, according to the account in Genesis 19:26. Orpheus looks back at Eurydice following him, and loses her forever. Brooding about failures and mistakes is not good for our spiritual and mental health. Dwelling on "what might have been" does not help us get to "what might be."


We must look ahead and wonder what's next. "What will this year bring forth? What will I be able to achieve? How will my family and I be affected by this or that force? What will I do to improve my health? What will happen that will alter my life? What can I reasonably expect?" Perhaps as a congregation we're wondering, "Where is God leading us? What can we do better to utilize our gifts in the kingdom of God?" "What's next for us?" The apostle Paul has some ideas that might help us to live for Jesus.

Paul not only writes about forgetting the past, but he says, "Straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus" (v. 14). Paul wasn't thinking of the turn of the calendar, however, but of the turn in his life that began with his Damascus Road conversion. In that journey, Paul does something intentional about the backward look: He chooses to forget what lies behind. He does something intentional about the future as well: Using the imagery of a footrace in which all the attention of the runner is focused on the finish line, Paul says he strains forward to what lies ahead, pressing on toward the goal of eternal life with Christ.

The author of Hebrews cautions us, using the same racing or running metaphor as the apostle Paul: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus..." (Hebrews 12:1-2).

Let's look to Jesus!
