
WELCOME BACK TO YOUTH GROUP!

Mount Clemens First UMC Memorial Garden

In September of 2017, after much consideration, planning, and a dedication to honoring our families, our church went through a process of creating a holy space for families to lay the ashes of their loved ones. Since then, our Memorial Garden has been lovingly cared for and stands ready to receive the saints of our church. We have now inhumed ashes in the garden and have people who have made their intentions for themselves or their loved ones to eventually be in the garden. Financial Report

This will provide a summary of our finances through July.

2021 BUDGET

Our pledged giving is \$5,400 (\$143,519 to \$138,123) over budget, although part of that is attributable to some pre-payments. Our non-pledged giving is a little more than \$2,000 (\$28,043 to \$25,962) over budget. We will not have \$2,500 budgeted revenue from a garage sale. Overall, our revenues have been solid.

We have been paying our apportionments (\$19,140 to date) at 70% as budgeted, which is the highest rate we have paid in several years. We are about \$6,000 below budget in total salaries and benefits (\$86,987 to \$93,130) and about \$2,000 below budget in total occupancy and support (\$83,635 to \$85,918). These are our two biggest overall expenses. In short, our performance against budget has been strong to date.

MINISTRY IN THE MAKING

This is a critical area for our church and will be a focus moving forward.

In December 2014, we entered into a 15 year mortgage for \$698,437 with the United Methodist Union after several years of rollover mortgages where we paid only interest. In December 2015, the mortgage balance was \$647,521. In June 2016, we conducted the Ministry in the Making campaign. As of now, our mortgage balance is approximately \$190,014, a reduction of \$508,423. Our monthly interest payments have gone from about \$1,950 to about \$700. If we pay only the mortgage payment and no additional payments, the mortgage will be paid by September 2024, at the latest, more than a five-year reduction in the payment period. We also have outstanding pledges totaling approximately \$42,000, and we hope that a significant portion of those will be paid. The annual cost of our mortgage is \$63,060, which is 18.5% of our 2021 budget. It will be a significant event to have that paid and to be able to utilize that money to do the things that truly make a church a church.
