Ponderings from your Pastor

I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church at Cenchreae, 2 so that you may welcome her in the Lord, as is fitting for the saints, and help her in whatever she may require from you, for she has been a benefactor of many and of myself as well. Romans 16: 1-2 NRSV

On May 4th, 1956 the Methodist Episcopal Church elected to Ordain Women to be full Elder's in the church. It would not be until 20 years later, in 1976, that women would be allowed to be voting delegates of the General Conference in the United Methodist Church. Although we have come a long way since then, even today, women, especially women of diverse backgrounds, continue to face challenges and rise above them to serve God and the church in powerful ways. In celebration of our clergy women here are a few people every United Methodist should know by heart.

<u>Susanna Wesley</u> – Thought of as the "Mother of Methodism" not only because she was John and Charles Wesley's mother, but because she was instrumental in their faith and the way the early church would eventually be organized. Susanna also held home prayer meetings with members of the community, and even encouraged lay leadership and preaching. She instilled faith, order, compassion, and collaboration into her children. While her husband Samuel was a pastor, Susanna was also a clear faith leader for her family and community. The echoes of her instruction and example live on today!

<u>Anna Howard Shaw</u> – Along with being a Physician, suffragette, and respected leader, Anna Howard Shaw was also one of the very first women ordained in the Methodist tradition. Anna was the only woman in her class at the Boston University School of Theology and spent many years as a local preacher. She was denied ordination in the Methodist Episcopal Church, but moved to the Methodist Protestant Church and was ordained under great protest in 1880. She was known to be an incredible orator and was deeply influential in women's suffrage movement as well as the journey to full ordination for women. She passed away just a few months before congress passed the 19th amendment, giving women the right to vote. She shaped our church and societal history!

<u>Georgia Harkness</u> – If you see faculty and students wearing red shoes at Garrett Evangelical Theological seminary, it is in honor of Georgia Harkness and her legacy. Georgia continually pushed boundaries by becoming ordained in 1926 (although she was not allowed to pastor a church or be in full connection until 1956) and becoming the first ever female professor of theology at a seminary. She taught applied Theology at Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary starting in 1939. To this day there are scholarships for women entering ministry given in her honor!

<u>Bishop Linda Lee</u> - Rev. Dr. Linda Lee was the first African American clergy woman elected to be Bishop in the Northcentral Jurisdiction. She came out of, and was appointed to return to, Detroit Conference in 2000. Bishop Lee served 4 years in Detroit Conference and 8 additional years in Wisconsin. Bishop Lee served as the chair of Black Clergywomen of the United Methodist Church from 1996-1998, and was also District Superintendent in the Detroit Conference from 1995 until she was elected Bishop. In 2022 the North Central Jurisdiction elected its third Black Clergywoman, Bishop Kennetha Bigham-Tsai, who was also elected out of our Michigan Area Conference, and is now serving in Iowa. Bishop Linda Lee paved the way, supported many other clergywomen and men, and became a wonderful leader for our conference in a way that helped the entirety of our church to hear and value the voices of black clergywomen more concretely. We celebrate her ministry!

First United Methodist Church Protection Policy Update and Training

Thanks to Tim Howlett and Terri Brown of our Leadership Team who helped to update our Protection Policy. The updated policy has been approved by our Leadership Team and we are ready to begin training. All adults and youth (16 and 17 years old) who work with children, youth, and vulnerable persons will need to take this training and be background checked. If you were trained before the pandemic, you will need to re-train. This is vital to the safety and security of our children, youth, and vulnerable persons. Training will be offered in-person, on Zoom, or self-guided should you be unavailable for the other training times. If you have taken the Safe-Gatherings training through the Michigan Annual Conference, your authorization is valid for our policy and you will not need to go through our training. You will only need to provide a copy of your Safe Gatherings authorization certificate to be kept on file at the church.

In Person Trainings will be Saturday July 8 from 4:00 PM-6:00 PM (child care will be available) and Sunday July 30 from 11:30-1:30. Zoom Training will be Wednesday August 2 from 7:00 PM- 9:00 PM.




Summer Mission Team
